OHS Student Named Outstanding Participant in National Achievement Scholarship Program

(OSSINING, N.Y.) – Ossining High School Senior Brandon Allen has been named an outstanding participant in the 2008 National Achievement Scholarship Program. He is among 3,000 students who scored in the top 5 percent of more than 140,000 Black Americans who requested consideration in the program when they took the 2006 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. A roster of these students' names, high schools and tentative college majors is being sent to approximately 1,500 colleges and universities.

The Ossining Union Free School District, nationally recognized for its mission to further the success of all children, serves approximately 4,200 pupils in six schools: Roosevelt School for newborn to four-year-olds, Park Early Childhood Center for kindergarten through first grade, Brookside School for grades two and three, Claremont School for grades four and five, Anne M. Dorner Middle School for grades six through eight, and Ossining High School for grades nine through 12.
