MINUTES

The Transportation Referendum of the qualified voters of the Ossining Union Free School District was held in the Harvey Culp Gymnasium, Ossining High School, 29 South Highland Avenue, Ossining, County of Westchester, New York, on Tuesday, April 16, 2013, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. for the purpose of voting upon a proposition consisting of capital improvements and alterations to various District school buildings and sites.

Mrs. Diane Leo served as Co-Chairperson of this Transportation Referendum and Ms. Ileana Ortiz, District Clerk, served as the Clerk of the Meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 a.m. The reading of the call for the Transportation Referendum was dispensed with; however, proof of publication was available for review. Also available for review was the voter registration list of the District and a listing of requests for Absentee Ballots. The votes of this Transportation Referendum Vote were by ballot on voting machines. The hours during which the polls remained open were 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. A poll list containing the names and legal residence of each voter was kept by the Clerk of the Meeting.

An Inspector of the Election was present at 6:45 a.m. and he examined each voting machine to be used. He found them to be in order. The counters on the machines showed 000. The seals were in place, the ballot labels were in their proper position and each machine was in all respects in proper condition for use.

At 9:00 p.m. the polls were declared closed. The District Clerk and the District Legal Counsel canvassed the votes cast and completed the count after everyone had voted. The canvass was open and public. The results of the Transportation Referendum of April 16, 2013 are as follows:

There were a total of 1,247 persons recorded as voting. This count includes verified absentee and paper ballots.
