## **2.2 Continued Discussion and Adoption of Proposed 2015-2016 District Budget**

Superintendent of Schools Raymond Sanchez and Assistant Superintendent for Business Alita Zuber provided an overview of the proposed 2015-2016 School District Budget via a PowerPoint presentation.

The proposed budget is aligned with needs and costs, remains solvent, continues to utilize various partnerships and grants for funding, maintains optimal class size, maintains school programs, is within the tax cap levy, and is an overall fiscally smart budget.

At the conclusion of the presentation, Board discussion took place. Members of the Board thanked Mr. Sanchez, Ms. Zuber and the entire administrative team for their hard work in developing the proposed budget.

Mr. Sanchez encouraged the community to attend the May 12<sup>th</sup> Mandatory Budget Hearing and to come out and vote on May 19<sup>th</sup> in the gymnasium at Ossining High School between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
